## The Week in Review:

- It was so great to see so many parents, grandparents, parishioners, and friends at the *Tickled Pink! Taste of St. Leonard* last Saturday! We are so appreciative of the support of our PTO committee members, donors, families, parishioners, and friends. Special thanks to our 8<sup>th</sup> graders for being such gracious servers and table bussers. Please continue to join us for upcoming PTO and school activities!
- Congratulations to Morry O., Andrew R., Megan L., Alaina L., Avery M., Kaelyn D., Mattie C., and Jaela C., who were named a "Delegation of Excellence" at the Kentucky Youth Assembly (KYA) early this week. Their Bluegrass Bill 29 "Solving Drunk Driving" (authors Alaina and Avery) passed both the House and Senate and was signed into law for KYA at the State Capital in Frankfort. That is the highest level of achievement possible for a Bluegrass Bill written by first year delegates! Commonwealth Bill 43 "Motorcycle Safety" (authors Kaelyn and Megan) passed through Round 1 debates but was defeated in Round 2. Andrew was named a Pro-Tempore Chair for the second round dockets, and Jaela was named a Parliamentarian! Thanks to our KYA Moderator, Mrs. Maddie Schepers for guiding the students through the bill-writing and debating processes and Mrs. Sally Locraft for chaperoning.
