- When you attend mass this weekend, you will see the St. Leonard Day of the Dead display in the back of church. The **Dia de los Muertos** *Offrenda* celebrates the lives of the family members of students and staff of St. Leonard Community School who have passed away. Students and staff contributed photographs of their loved ones to our counselor **Mrs. Beasley**, and these were often accompanied by stories of happy memories and things that the deceased loved during life. Students in the fourth through eighth grades studied the symbolism and traditions of the holiday in Spanish class with their teacher **Senora Esparza**, and she taught them how to make tissue paper flowers. Created by Mrs. Beasley and Senora Esparza and rich in symbolism, the colors of the altar represent purity and mourning. The layers signify heaven and earth and each of the elements are present: candles (fire), earth (salt), water (water and other drinks), air (delicate tissue paper decorations). It is believed that loved ones return to us in spirit for the Day of the Dead, and the candles light their way to us. The food, beverages, and salt represent the flavors of life they have left behind.

- Our students have taken on the November Writing Challenge. During the month of November, students and staff will track the number of words they have written to meet classroom goals of writing as many words as in an age-appropriate novel. The kindergarteners will each write 1000 words, 1<sup>st</sup> graders are writing 2,000 words, 2<sup>nd</sup> graders are writing 3,000 words, 3<sup>rd</sup> graders are writing 10,000 words, 4<sup>th</sup> graders are writing 20,000 words, 5<sup>th</sup> graders are writing 20,000 words, and the 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> graders are each writing 25,000 words. The teachers have a goal of at least 30,000 words. If all of the students meet their goals, St. Leonard collectively will have written 1,878,000 words!
