- A message from the 7<sup>th</sup> grade about their Dare to Care Service Project which runs through Wednesday, 10/19:

On Thanksgiving Eve, in 1969, a nine-year-old boy died of hunger. People were devastated over this. The next day a newspaper headline was titled, "Do We Dare to Care?" A few people came together and started Dare to Care, an organization which brought us together as a community to take care of others by donating food and money for those who are hungry. Just think of not having a decent meal every day.

The 7th graders are leading a drive to help our community. We are collecting food items or money donations if you prefer; 25 dollars will provide 100 meals. According to the Dare to Care website, last year Dare to Care Food Bank provided over 16 million meals in 13 counties of Kentuckiana. They distribute food to food pantries, emergency kitchens, and shelters; they sponsor Kids' Cafes, the Backpack Buddy program, and mobile pantry programs.

There are rewards for daring to care. Along with feeding the hungry, the class (or teachers) with the most cans will get to play an appropriate song after announcements for a week. If we reach our goal of 200 cans, we will have a school-wide P.J. Day. Monetary donations will count as one can for each dollar donated.

Please donate money or bring in the following recommended foods: **peanut butter**, **soup**, **canned fruit**, **beans**, **rice**, **tuna**, **cereal**, **fruit juice**, **pasta**, **canned vegetables**. Let's help stop this hunger; let's donate! We appreciate your generosity!
