SUPPORTING LIFELONG SCHOLARS

Our school lunch program is off to a great start! Mrs. Hart provided samples of food items at the WWB, and the children enjoyed hot meals this week. The menu is posted to Sycamore and the school website. Meals include the entrée, fruit and vegetable sides, and your child's choice of milk, fruit juice, or water. Cost of a meal is \$3.25. Additional entrees can be purchased for \$1.65, with extra sides available for \$0.75. Students may also purchase extra drinks or bring their lunch and buy the milk, juice, or water for \$0.50. Parents can access their child's lunch account information to view account balances and items purchased for lunch through Sycamore. Funds can be added to the account through PayJunction or by check/money sent to the school office. Please contact the school office if you have questions or need your Sycamore log-in.

- Join us for our Solar Eclipse Party, Monday August 21st on the soccer field from 1:00-3:00 pm, for a view of the partial solar eclipse. Students and their families can be citizen scientists, helping NASA collect data on temperature, cloud coverage and animal behavior. NASA-approved eclipse glasses that meet the transmission requirements of ISO 12312-2 for direct observation of the sun and snacks will be provided. (Donations are gladly accepted.) Students have been made aware of the dangers of looking directly at the sun at any time and have practiced the procedure for putting on and taking off the glasses. Students must have a signed permission slip to attend and are asked to bring a water bottle (to fill with ice water) and a beach towel to sit on.
- We are happy to say our music program is expanding at St. Leonard School! Mrs. Radeker would like to purchase a class set of Boomwhackers ™, pitched plastic tubes that are played with the hands. The set will be used by all grades, but concentrated for 1st, 2nd, 5th, and 6th grade. It's a fantastic way to teach musical tones, pitch, rhythm, and the science of sound. We would also like to purchase three snare drum heads for our 7th and 8th grade "bucket band". The bucket band not only teaches music fundamentals, but also reinforces math facts. And lastly, we would like music for the kids to perform in class as well as in public performances. The music would represent 20th and 21st century styles of music as well as world music to reinforce language arts and social studies.
