Library becomes 'makerspace'

St. Leonard School is committed to ensuring that their students are 21st century learners who know how to "Learn. Serve. Lead. Succeed." This school year, the middle school students are engaged in a school-wide collaborative learning project—transforming the school library into a full media center with a Makerspace.

The school implemented "20% Time," a twice-weekly class specifically targeted to the sixth through eighth grades for students to be creative and innovative, use critical thinking and problem-solving skills and communicate and collaborate with others.

"20% Time" is based on concepts from companies like Google and 3M. These companies give their employees one day a week to work on projects of their choice that have the potential to be a product for the company.

The goal for the St. Leonard middle school students is to explore concepts that are important to them and that have an impact on others, as well as projects that allow them to research and demonstrate media and information literacy to be successful after they leave school.

The library project began as an initial school-wide collaborative-learning project, walking the students through the research and writing process to build competency in these areas before diving into their individual projects of student choice. The students began this project together by brainstorming ideas, which ranged from the very ambitious (adding a second-floor loft) to the more manageable (adding a Lego wall).

Guided by the middle school teaching team, students determined commit-

tees needed to complete their work and then applied for positions on those committees.

Currently, they are working in small groups to handle everything from the budget to fundraising and furniture to technology. They create agendas for meetings, keep detailed notes and plan from these. They even created a public relations team to share their project with the outside world and to get the input of parish and community groups that use the space.

Students designed a new layout, held bake sales for initial fundraising, moved bookshelves and books and created the beginnings of the Makerspace. They are in the process of finishing their plans for full use of the media center and are presenting these to the school and parish councils. Once final approval is given for their plans, they will continue to take part in the physical work of transforming the space.

While work on the library/
media center continues for
the remainder of the school
year, students also will transition into their individual
projects — questions or problems that they would like to
answer or solve that are not
routinely covered in school.

Projects proposed by the students include creating a butterfly garden for migrating monarch butterflies, a

website for different book fandoms, a website and business selling Derby fascinators, a 3-D printed instrument, a video game that teaches multiplication and division and a website to match volunteers with service opportunities.

The St. Leonard Community has been energized by the creativity the students have shown and is very pleased to see how students connect the skills they are using in "20% Time" with their core content area classes. Students have shown increased confidence in their writing, research and public speaking skills. They organize meetings with project stakeholders, give presentations to the whole middle school and even organize fundraising events.

In addition, this time has helped build and strengthen relationships — among the students in the differing grades, between the teachers and students and among the four teachers and librarian who co-teach the class. Students are excited and so are the teachers. The entire community is thrilled to see the growth of this project and the other projects that are accomplished as the year progresses.
